As we edge towards the summer holiday, we look back on another busy half term. Following our return in June, school visited the Bowes Museum for its Lego Exhibition. The first school to take part in the coding workshop, pupils were thrilled to discover that by programming software correctly, they could make their Lego models move! Pupils decided

that we should develop IT in school through Technical Lego and embarked on a fundraising campaign, culminating in a fantastic cake sale. Pupils raised £170 towards this project and we look forward to developing this challenge within our curriculum in September. Our River Swale Mural has been on tour. Exhibited in St Mary's Church during the Hornby in Bloom celebrations, it has also been displayed in the Locomotion Museum in Shildon. Your comments about the high standard of the art work and the amount of local detail have been passed on to the pupils – thank you. We started our Romeo and Juliet study with a valuable workshop from Konflux Theatre.



Pupils are now rehearing for a challenging end of year production which draws on the original text. This study has given our juniors the opportunity to develop their knowledge of the storyline which they explored and interpreted successfully for their performance at York's Barbican Theatre. Singing was the focus during a visit from the National Youth Choirs. All pupils enjoyed working with a specialist to develop their technique and confidence. These skills will be developed further preparing for our production and end of year celebrations. School trips have seen the whole school visit the North York Moors National Park to develop map reading and compass skills through challenging activities. The juniors extended their study of the River Swale through a visit to the Keld Resource Centre. It was fascinating to look around and see the landscape which we'd identified during our ordnance survey map work. Celebrating the end of their hard work for SATs, Y6 took part in the Innovations Festival, completing workshops on blogging and nutrition during a busy day at Ripon Racecourse. Following our final swimming session, we will enjoy lunch at the swimming pool, followed by an afternoon at Richmond Castle. Pupils continue to develop their cycling confidence with playground and on road sessions. We enjoy watching pupils' progress as they extend their skills with Stage 1 Cycles. All pupils have enjoyed swimming success throughout the year and, working with a local coach, we introduced tennis during the summer term. We now look forward to developing pupils' confidence through climbing wall and skateboarding sessions next term. We also look forward next year, to developing a partnership with Kiplin Hall to investigate the role of some home grown Yorkshire produce in a healthy diet. We hope you enjoy a wonderful summer. 

On Saturday 18th May Trinity Dental Clinic was 'officially' opened by Vice President Her Excellency Jewel Howard Taylor. There are only 6 fully qualified dentists in Liberia (population 4.8 million); we like to think we offer the best dental care in the country!! It makes a massive difference to many peoples' lives. We seek to serve in Jesus' Name. There were speeches in the ELWA hospital chapel and



then the ribbon was cut! Simon has fitted all the new equipment. 8 operating lights, 7 suction units (made in Italy, sent to South Africa then shipped to Liberia ... via Germany!). The long-awaited UK freight, which had been at the Port in Monrovia since 23rd March, was delivered on June 3rd. We thank God for their safe arrivals. It has

been amazing, all our practical skills have been able to be used here, and with a couple of exceptions, everything's gone together well! What a blessing, when it is such an effort getting things here in the first place! Meanwhile, Grace has kept occupied, this month teaching the ELWA hospital nurses. We had some critical care training which has greatly improved care in the children's ward. Grace enjoyed a couple of weeks of sewing curtains for the Guest House and overseeing its facelift. It is nearly 2 years since we came to live in Liberia. Our first term will end in the summer. We will be in the UK until the end of November, speaking most weekends and with some midweek meetings. On Wednesday 24th July, another demonstration is being planned for people to express their concerns over the economic situation. In April the exchange rate was LD160 to USD1, currently it is 200LD. We are prepared for any eventuality and so have our 'GO' bags packed, just in case. In the midst of all the busy-ness we have sometimes felt overwhelmed with peoples' vulnerability, as we clearly cannot meet the needs of everyone one asks. We try to point people to Jesus, keeping our focus on Him and bringing our anxiety to God. "What does the Lord require of us? To act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God." Micah 6:8.
