Liberia News

Simon and Grace Stretton-Downes



Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us update with the news they send. Simon and Grace have many difficult issues and this week have asked for prayer for various things that are complex. Simon says Eddie is in the middle of his first year dental exams and the next few weeks will be make or break for him. If he doesn't pass these exams his hopes of

becoming a dentist will end and he will return to Liberia feeling that the last 2 years have been wasted. Prayer for Simon that he would have great wisdom with all the large, many and varied dental cases he sees. He repaired 4 broken jaws in August by wiring them. There is lots of reviewing of these and all the complex new things arising. Prayer for wisdom in dealing with some upcoming staffing issues. Preparing the dental budget for the next year. Simon has to teach the resident doctors in their 2-week assignment to the clinic. Some are more interested than others!

Prayer for Grace as she continues to meet the mothers of malnourished children and share Bible truths with them. The continued audits, this time looking at Doctor instructions and prescriptions as well as nurses carrying those out. This is quite a challenge! Prayer for workable strategy and outcomes in the hospital following a meeting Grace has on the 8th with Jason their CEO where they will be discussing all of the above. Grace prays for all of us who pray for them to be encouraged to know and see God answers prayers. Thank you all for praying. Simon and Grace are going away on the 9th September for a couple of nights to rest and celebrate Simon's birthday this week and they are really looking forward to that!

And Finally

From Rev'd Chris

Can I start by saying an enormous thank you to all who helped to prepare St Marys' Hornby for our first gathered worship services last weekend. It was wonderful to worship together in person again after so many months. We had 35 people with us including a small scratch choir. As we continue to work out how to live and love and learn in a time of Covid we will need to reopen our buildings for worship. We are planning to run the current rota until Sunday 4th October and then have St Patrick's and St Michael's open for worship in the mornings on alternate weeks and St Oswald's, St Andrew's, and St Gregory's open for evening worship on a rotating basis. We are currently trialling running Phone Church from two of our buildings and may be able to combine Gathered and PhoneChurch, however, we are committed to continuing PhoneChurch for those who are still not comfortable in gatherings.

Can I also thank all who lead worship whilst I was on Holiday. As well as time at home we managed to get

away to North Berwick for a week and found it very restorative and a wonderful place to be. Whilst I love the Dales, I also love the sea. Standing in the space between land and sea with the saltwater washing over my feet I was struck by a sense of how much has changed this year but also how quickly our footprints are erased and everything becomes normal again. However, there is a truth in understanding that what might seem like a return to normal is a subtle and dangerous view. With each wave, even the smallest of particles of sand is moved and changed, altered and finds a new place to rest. And I too was not the same, the experience of the sea at my feet had changed me. And so it is with our worship and our buildings, some of the changes are subtle and temporary, but in some respects, we can never go back to how it was before. I also feel that we still need to be very careful not to become complacent about the virus, its



spread and its lifechanging consequences for many who suffer. With so few cases and even fewer deaths in our area, it would be all to easy to think that we are safe. So for the moment, I intend to imitate the 'Watcher' who stands at the top of North Berwick's Lifeboat slipway - Steady and Sure but also poised to call for action when it is needed. Watching and waiting are common biblical themes but if you have the time lookup Proverbs 8 and come and watch with me.
