Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The cousent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us update with the news they send. On Wednesc December, Grace and Simon will be up early to drive to Buchanan, a town on the coast some 70 miles s Monrovia. They, together with Wannie, Daniel, Helena and Charles, will be setting up a dental outreach c school classroom for 2 days. Already they have heard that over 50 people have registered to see them, hope that the message that they will only be offering extractions has been heard.

They are being hosted by a local (SIM related) church and they trust that the Good News will also be shathis time. The local language is Bassa (which, at least, Daniel speaks). They plan to stay overnight in a and return to ELWA on Thursday evening.

Meanwhile, Eddie has been continuing in his quest – now in its third year – to get himself and Matilda's I Nurse Practitioner qualification (gained in India several years ago) recognised by the Liberian governme LMDC (Liberia Medical & Dental Council) have lost their application papers on at least 2 occasions and c Eddie is having to help design the new membership card! Simon is particularly keen to have Matilda 'of recognised so that she has more credibility, and so validate Trinity Dental Clinic ministry in the absence c

Needless to say, there is no further news on Eddie's exam results. Last Saturday Simon made a gate fo and Nicolas's front porch to keep their younger children contained when they return in January. When he Monday he said that it was a public holiday there and he was pottering.

They are currently trying to book their flights to South Africa to hopefully arrive on 22nd December. They
