Liberia News



Simon and Grace Stretton-Downes

Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM).

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us updated with the news they send. Simon says that the VP has appointed someone to help raise funds for the school - she is going to call a meeting of people from large organisations around Liberia. A few people have offered support to fund students. As a result, Simon has been meeting with the head of the Evangelical Churches of Liberia, ECOL, and he has found 2 students and now will find a third - these 3 will be able to use their skills as part of the church's ministry. So, they have a full complement of 4 staff member students and 4 outside students. They are getting the classroom ready at the moment. He is very excited and thankful for this accomplished progress. The main stumbling block remains lecture preparation and he asks specifically for prayer in this regard. Also their Indian friends Renju and Serin are seeking to come and join them to help with the teaching. They need to raise funds for their travelling costs. There is still no word on Eddie's exam results.

Grace says that a new family arrived from Canada to join their SIM team. She has spent a lot of time supervising the cleaning, fixing and preparing of their home. They really only had a couple of days to do this as the previous people didn't move out on time. A bit of "they'll need this, and this they will find this useful" when they really just wanted to clear the place! The new family will come for dinner on Friday 9th September. Grace went with fellow SIM-er Christelle who is having sewing lessons from Grace, to the waterside market to buy all the bits and pieces she needs to

accompany her new sewing machine. Grace will buy fabric for the Dental Therapy School curtains which need to get in place. There is a gathering on Saturday 10th for 3 people leaving them and to welcome the new family. There is also Simon's birthday on Saturday to celebrate and Grace has a cake to back for that! Happy birthday Simon!

Simon wrote last Sunday 25th September and said it was time for reflection and a time to give thanks to God and to everyone for the help and support given as their new project of the Dental School. This has been a dream for many years and it is about to begin!

Most of the lectures for the first week have been checked and edited. There is still work and further reflection and adjustment needed in the timetable to avoid overwhelming their students. Please pray for Archie, Daniel, Charles and Matilda, their staff students, along with Janet, Vestee, Ellen and Ruth their external students. In just a week's time, by God's grace, they will begin. Glory to God.

Today 30th September he tells us that it is the induction afternoon for the Liberia Dental Therapy School. Classes begin on Monday 3rd October. 3 of the 7 modules will be taught by Simon. Many of the presentations have been prepared by others but edited to a greater or lesser extent by him and this will be an ongoing process.

Simon and Grace are preparing material for one of those modules. The first semester will last into January they expect. However as usual they are adapting as they go along.

This will have happened by the time this is printed but Simon and Grace value every prayer as this work develops for the benefit of future generations. As always they thank you all for your prayers and support of them in their ministry. It is very important to them.
