Funerals may now only happen at the Crematorium or at the graveside. Only immediate family members can attend (if the crematorium allows) – that is, spouse or partner, parents and children, keeping their distance in the prescribed way.

Over the past three and a half years more and more worshipping communities have dedicated the days between Ascension and Pentecost to pray 'Come Holy Spirit'.

We are praying that the Spirit will inspire and equip us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with our friends and families, our communities and networks. It has been amazing how many varied ways there have been in which people from every tradition have taken up this challenge. The effects have been remarkable

It is our prayer that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus

Christ and his love for the world will hear it for themselves, and respond and follow Him. Specifically, we again invite each and every Christian across the country to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of 5 friends who have not responded with their 'Yes' to God's call.

## **Liberia News - Rosemary Gaven**

As Pew News is now running every other week here are the latest 2 updates for you.

#### From 14/05/20

Last Friday Simon sent a young man, with a large swelling under his jaw from a dental abscess, over to the main hospital to get intravenous antibiotics. Sadly, that evening he died from the infection. It is a reminder of how serious tooth decay can be if left untreated. He says that patient numbers seem to be picking up a bit this past week but they are still just opening the clinic on Mondays, Wednesday and Fridays. So, the fact that to-day, Thursday is a Public Holiday doesn't make much difference to him!

Simon has completed his Dental Clinic budget and project proposal for the next 5 years and he has been looking at an idea to conduct a dental survey of the children in their ELWA Academy at some point in the future. Cycling around the compound has become an almost daily discipline and he is trying to get in 4-5 laps which is 8-9 miles.

Grace in the meantime tells me that they have had some socially distanced people over and offered hospitality 3 times in the last week. It was good to link up with family and also on church zoom calls and All Soul's in London for worship last Sunday.

She has now started helping the under fives malnutrition clinic admissions. Some of them are teen and/or single Mums. Life is tough for them. She is just getting to know them and helping them to know God sees and cares about their plight and their sick child. Listening to their stories, their fears about life, their sick child and family situation. She is praying with them as it is a way to help them and feel their situation matters to God. It is mostly listening, the doctors are calling it "mother craft". She says she is out of her depth and she is trusting God to give her the words they need to hear to make them feel valued by Jesus.

As always they thank those who pray for them so faithfully and send greetings to you all.

#### From 21/05/20


Simon said that Loranzo, their clinic administrator, has uncovered evidence of their receptionist altering patient receipts and pocketing the difference. They are posting to hire a new receptionist. This is sad as she has been with the clinic for 8 years and also implicates, by inference, some of the clinicians whom Simon trained. Sad and frustrating.

Patient numbers are starting to increase again. Over 30 emergencies to-day, Wednesday. If this continues they will go back to a 5 day week.

Grace has been helping one of the missions girls to learn to sew. She has enjoyed this outlet for creativity! She is going to the paediatric ward, listening and sharing God's love and reading an encouraging verse or two for the mummies. Also praying for healing for the sick and malnourished babies. They usually only stay in hospital to get established on the food programme for the under fives, so the visits are 3 times a week to ensure they develop a trust and they feel able to share.

Otherwise, regular socially distanced prayer meetings and their video Church on Sundays. Keeping up with family also takes time!

They appreciate all of our prayers for them.
