

Centering Prayer Introductory Course Online

St Oswald's Church, Sowerby & Hambleton Centering Prayer Meeting

Centering Prayer is both a method and a relationship which prepares us to awaken to the gift of contemplation and to rest in God. It is a discipline of

intentional silence, and a way of surrender to the Divine Presence.

It is complementary to other forms of prayer. Be still and know that I am God. Ps.46:10

This course will take place online (via Zoom) on two mornings.

Each morning consists of two talks, an opportunity to practice Centering Prayer, and times for discussion.

Centering Prayer was originally developed in the mid-1970's by Fr Thomas Keating OCSO and other Trappist monks of St Joseph's Abbey, Massachussetts. Firmly rooted in the Christian tradition, and the teachings of Jesus (Matthew 6:6), it is inspired by the 14th century anonymous English spiritual classic, The Cloud of Unknowing. This introductory course is both for those who are drawn to silent prayer and would like to explore further, and also for those who may already have a practice of silent prayer, and want to explore further. Participants will be provided

with both the tools to practice Centering Prayer and some of the conceptual background.

Introductory Followup Series: A six-eight week Introductory follow-up Series of 90 minute meetings (via Zoom) will also take place, for those who wish to continue, hosted and led by the Hambleton Centering Prayer Meeting, Sowerby. It will include time to practice within a supportive group setting, and to explore concepts in more depth. Details to follow. All welcome. For further information contact:

Simon and Grace Stretton-Downes

Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us update with the news they send. Simon and Grace are faced with another situation at the dental clinic regarding financial irregularities. They are praying for the truth to be revealed. It is a horrible time.

They are looking for new staff for the chairside and a Janitor/Laundry person. Only five people have applied. Grace audits hospital charts. Anomalies have been revealed here too. She has meetings on Thursday with the

hospital hierarchy to see how they proceed with clear protocols and proper consequences for actions/inactions. A few important changes would make a huge difference.

They are really tired and thunderstorms at night make for very disturbed sleep. Rainy season has it's pluses though - beautiful sunsets!

They thank God for His faithfulness, and sovereignty, and that He is perfectly trustworthy and thank you for praying.



And Finally

From Rev'd Chris

This Sunday sees the reopening for gathered worship of both St Michael and All Angles Spenithorne and St Gregory's Crakehall.

We are so glad that we can once again gather to hear God's word, receive the sacraments, and share in fellowship. We have found at St Mary's that although things are still significantly different to what we are used to and the building looks a bit strange in its COVID Secure layout, we are able to worship together. The Benefice choir will continue to focus each week on the communion service but we hope to include music in most of our services in some way, whilst we remain prohibited from congregational singing. I have received a few messages of concern especially about St Gregory's, but the same also holds true for St Andrews and St Oswalds so I will try and address them here. You will see from the rota that St Gregory's only have afternoon services, this is because the building is only able to hold a small number of worshipers due to Government COVID regulations. Where before we could easily accommodate over 100 we are now extremely limited to 14 if people come on their own and maximum of 34 if people come in groups of 6!

For this reason, we have decided to have the morning services in the larger capacity buildings and Evensong in the

smaller ones. At St Andrew's and St Oswald's, this will be a BCP Evensong. At St Gregory's we will have a Taize and a Revive service, both of these services are similar to a traditional evensong with bible reading, prayers, reflection and music. The music at the Revive service will be from contemporary church musicians and from The Tiazè community. The Taizé Community is an ecumenical Christian monastic fraternity in Taizé, Saône-et-Loire, Burgundy, France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Catholic and Protestant traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world. It was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Schütz, a Reformed Protestant. Guidelines for the community's life are contained in The Rule of Taizé written by Brother Roger and first published in French in 1954. Taizé has become one of the world's most important sites of Christian pilgrimage, with a focus on youth. Over 100,000 young people from around the world make pilgrimages to Taizé each year for prayer, Bible study, sharing, and communal work. Through the community's ecumenical outlook, they are encouraged to live in the spirit of kindness, simplicity and reconciliation.

If you would like to listen to music from the community which can be described as "meditative singing" please see this Youtube Channel

I hope this helps answer some of the questions that have been raised, please do be in touch with myself or the Wardens if there is anything else that we can help with.

And so as we come to a new pattern of normal I'm giving the final - Final Words to Rev'd Lisle who has written the following reflection on the Gospel reading for this Sunday.
