Simon and Grace Stretton-Downes

Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us update with the news they send. Simon has not been well and was off work last Thursday and Friday on antibiotics and was back to work on Monday. Angie started work as the new Clinic Administrator on Tuesday. Eddie still does not have any results of his examinations as apparently there has been a teacher's strike which is delaying things. While he was off sick Simon put together on a slide presentation for the Christian Dental Fellowship Conference which will be online next Saturday. Other than that he said they are just plodding along as it is extremely hot there and they are usually sitting rather damply in their clothes as it is so sweaty and humid. They are surviving but sadly any prospects of coming to the UK seems to be getting smaller and smaller although there is a thought in their minds that South Africa might be a possibility. However, they are not going to book anything for a few weeks yet as everything changes so quickly and they don't want to cancel yet more flights.

Grace tells me from her side that she has been doing bits and pieces at the hospital. She hasn't seen so much of the ladies last week but she has been getting things ready for the launch of the new nursing regime. The nurses have identified 4 areas that they are going to really improve on and those are going to be audited. They have six new supervisors and Grace, together with them and the nursing hierarchy had a discussion on Monday

and now they will be rolling out some teaching and then the supervisors will hopefully roll out that teaching to the nurses on the wards. This will improve the way things are documented, the care that is given, the responsibility of the nurses and what they should be doing rather than not doing those things. The things Grace has been auditing are the things they are now going to be tightening up on and she will continue to keep monitoring these improvements.

Grace and Simon had some hospitality last week. They have had 2 lots of people over including a new couple with a little girl. He is a doctor and she is a nurse practitioner and they seem a delightful American couple. They also had their South African friends over as well. Grace has also done a bit of sewing for the dental clinic - things that needed mending and alterations. And of course the housework in the heat keeping the place neat and tidy!

Today - Wednesday - they said it is 33 degrees and the humidity is 98% making it feel like 39 degrees. Hot! There has been little or no water for the last 4 days and at 11 this morning. the electricity went off. They had some more hospitality on Monday evening and their friends leave for USA to-night. Grace says she thinks they

are OK but the power and water situation is very draining. They are having the Dental team over for food and games on Friday which will be good fun at least! They are grateful and give thanks for our prayers as always.

Remembrance Sunday - We are planning to hold a short service of remembrance on Sunday 8th November



gathering at 10:45 at Spennithorne, Patrick Brompton, & Crakehall. The service will be much shorter than in previous years and will take place at the memorial.

Please see the current legislation for full details. This advice states -

Event organisers should keep numbers of those participating in the event to a minimum. For the avoidance of doubt, the following people are legally permitted to attend events to commemorate Remembrance Sunday as participants. Attendees should observe social distancing at all times. Attendees should also take advantage of opportunities for wreath layers to represent wider groups.

- people attending as part of their work (such as local councillors, local faith leaders, the local MP)
- · people attending in a voluntary capacity on behalf of a recognised organisation
- members of the armed forces
- · veterans of the armed forces, and/or their representatives or carers
- Members of the public are legally permitted to stop and watch the event as spectators, but event organisers should take reasonable steps to discourage the public from attending events, and be mindful of the risk that such events pose, especially to veterans who are often elderly.

Where members of the public do attend, they must only attend the event with their own household or those in their support bubble, or one other person (children under school age, as well as those dependent on round-the-clock care, such as those with severe disabilities, who are with their parents will not count towards the limit on 2 people meeting outside) and observe social distancing rules.

Please can I ask everyone to respect these regulations and remember that Sue will be leading a <u>PhoneChurch</u> service at the same time. If you wish to place crosses or wreaths please do so after the service has finished.
