Simon and Grace Stretton-Downes

Simon is a dentist leading a team at a clinic at the Eternal Love Winning All (ELWA) Hospital in Monrovia. Grace is a nurse and will support Simon as well as seeking God's direction for her role in the mission field. The couple are sent by St Gregory's Church, Crakehall and are working for Serving In Mission (SIM)

(Apologies for the slight delay in this update due to a change in PewNews delivery dates)

Rosemary Gaven is our local contact and keeps us update with the news they send. Grace was on the committee for the planning of their Spiritual Life Conference which took place on 12th May for 3 days which was good and kept them busy.

Simon has submitted the application for Wannie, one of their Dental Clinic staff to join Eddie in the Dental School in Nairobi as they could find nothing available in Liberia at all. To this end Simon is involved in the planning of a Dental

Therapist Training School to meet the needs of rural Liberia with the blessing of the Liberia Minister of Health. This will involve a lot of work and planning like their Trinity Clinic did so they are back to a very big project again.

The newly implemented computer programme by talented volunteers on site has resulted in a patient's clinical notes and payment being recorded on the same page which is far more efficient.

Last week Simon had a very full week of dentistry and calls to various partners for the planned Dental Therapy School. Grace is "buried" under a pile of operating theatre gowns needing mending, and drapes to be altered. She went to the down town market to buy suitable cloth for all of this last Friday which took 5 hours altogether just to get that.

Yesterday the local church honoured SIM missionaries in a very loud 3 hour service. In the afternoon they attended the 1st birthday party of the daughter of one of the dental staff. It was a very elaborate affair, the little girl quite overwhelmed! The children in Liberia don't have other birthday parties apart from the 1st one so that is for life. God is very much part of the Thanksgiving for this new child, that they made it through the first year of life. Needless to say, it was a very full and busy day for them.

It is amazing the huge progress they have made in the short time they have been there and prayer has borne so much fruit - please continue to pray for all their plans. They value all your prayers and give thanks each time they write for your important input into their lives which at best is not always easy.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations,

baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age (Matthew 28:19-20 - ESVUK)

This command, or as it is better known 'The Great Commission' is Jesus final instruction to his Disciples that Matthew records in his book of Good News. Far from passive, they are filled with drive and energy - Go. And go they did, without them fulfilling this commission we would not be gathering together online and in our sacred spaces. Without this instruction to Go, it is doubtful that the Jesus Way would have moved very far from the walls of the City of Jerusalem. And Go they did, carrying with them the message of God's love for all and the message of the Messiah, not just throughout the Judean countryside but right around the Roman Empire, into Africa and even across to India. Passing the message on and making new disciples, who in turn chose to carry the message even further, not just to distant lands but also down the ages right up to today right here in Lower Wensleydale. And that is exactly what I will be doing tomorrow when Oscar's parents carry him to the Font at St Mary's Church Hornby. This will be the first Baptism service since lockdown, the first for almost 16 months anywhere in our Benefice of 6 Churches. It feels somewhat fitting that the first is also in the same place as the last. For me, Baptism is a fantastic opportunity, a special day for the candidate and their family and also for the whole church. A chance to stop and give thanks to God, to place our trust in him, to tell again of all that Jesus did for us, to build each other up to Go. To Go to all the peoples all the places all the ages in the power of God's Holy Spirit! What a Mission, what a Commission - are you ready for an exciting adventure, then come with me and let's see what God has planned
