

As the church year comes to its final 'Season' of Kingdom we are given the time to reflect on what it is to Kingdom people, living Kingdom lives, in a Kingdom that is now but not yet, initiated but not actuated. Season starts with Remembering - All Saints - All Souls - All lost in war and conflict. And then is Crowr Christ as our King - King of a new Kingdom. We pray for that each time we pray 'Your Kingdom Come' Many have asked what that Kingdom look like - how do we live like that? Jesus showed us what that k is and his 'Good News' sets it out for us in how to Be

And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied.

"Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh.

"Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your nan on account of the Son of Man! Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in I for so their fathers did to the prophets.

"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation."

"Woe to you who are full now, for you shall be hungry.

"Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep.

"But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse for those who abuse you. To one who strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also, and from one who away your cloak do not withhold your tunic either. And as you wish that others would do to you, do so to the "If you love those who love you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love their you do good to those who do good to you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. I lend to those from whom you expect to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners back the same amount. But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, an reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil. merciful, even as your Father is merciful.

"Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you."

So this Kingdom Season - I will pause and look back, remembering all who I miss, all the saints who have before. And I will look forward in Hope for signs of his Kingdom here and now.
